# Charter

### Current

- A Standards Track specification that will include:
  - an Implementation Status section as described in RFC 7942
  - an Operational Considerations section to explain how the protocol is configured, deployed, and diagnosed and security and privacy mitigations for the protocol as identified in the threat analysis document. (q.v.)
- A YANG module focused on configuration and monitoring of protocol instances
- An Applicability Statement that describes how to deploy and configure the protocol in networks with different topologies
- A Security Threat Analysis document that describes the attack vectors, which shall be sent for publication at the same time as the protocol specification
