Living Documents & GROW: Routing Security Doc?

An opportunity for more work!!!

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Long standing issue

There is a lack of a canonical reference to a "how to secure EBGP sessions with prefix / as-path / rpki filters".

How we do things today: Routing Security information is spread out over various blog posts, RFCs, institutional and tribal knowledge, IRC logs, software README's, storytelling around the campfire.

Barriers to publication

Publishing an RFC takes a minimum of 12 months (this *generally* is a good thing for protocol extensions!)

BCPs are stable references, but point to RFCs

In routing security (for example), routing information data sources it should be possible to add/drop in a shorter cycle than 12 months

Perhaps a stable document reference, and use of quarterly revisions? Perhaps skip IETF-wide last call? Perhaps skip IESG review? Perhaps rely on just working group + routing directorate review?

Interest in IETF

It appears there is some interest in IETF to explore this direction, YANG people face similar issues
