

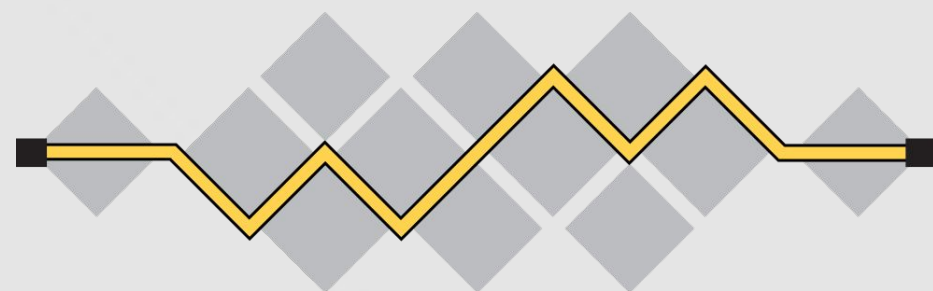

NomCom Experiment per RFC8989: Diverse Paths to Volunteer Qualification

For 2021: Experiment via RFC 8989 (one-off update to RFC 8713/BCP 10) increases from 1 to 3 paths for qualification.

Path 1: **Attendance.** *(This is the traditional path but modified to include remote participation)*

- The person has attended 3 out of the last 5 IETF meetings, including meetings held entirely online.

Path 2: **WG Leadership** (WG Chair or Secretary)

- The person has been a Working Group Chair or Secretary within the 3 years prior to the day the first call for NomCom volunteers is sent to the community

Path 3: **Authorship**

- The person has been a listed author or editor (on the front page) of at least two IETF Stream RFCs within the last 5 years prior to the day the call for NomCom volunteers is sent to the community. An Internet-Draft that has been approved by the IESG and is in the RFC Editor queue counts the same as a published RFC, with the relevant date being the date the draft was added to the RFC Editor

queue.



Making the Internet work better

Result of the RFC8989 Experiment

Total number of Qualified Volunteers: 116 (63% were qualified via more than one path).

Efficacy of the 3 different paths for qualification:

- Path 1 (Attendance) is *sufficient*.
 - By itself qualified **more than 97%** (113 of 116) of the volunteers
- Path 2 (WG Leadership) is *superfluous*.
 - It only appeared once, but with Path 3 as well.
- Path 3 (Authorship) is *marginal*.
 - It only qualified 3 volunteers independently of Path 1.

Looks like no justification for change.

Discussion of RFC8989 Experiment

Real question: why only 116 volunteers out of 1315 qualified?

- 116 is a low number, but not as low as **a decade ago**.
- Past NomComs: 143, 177, 200, 203, 128, 183, 139, 154, 134, 120, **101, 93, 99, 108**

Pandemic fatigue? Volunteer button too late? Something more ominous? Not to worry?
