Steps To Publication

- Post an Internet Draft (Mandatory)
- Discuss on mailing list (Mandatory)
- Present at meeting (Optional)
- WG Adoption (Mandatory)
- WG Last Call (Mandatory)

Posting An Internet Draft

- File name
 - Draft-yourname-v6ops-yourtopic
- Post a message to the V6OPS mailing list inviting review
- The chairs will determine whether the draft is in charter for the WG
 - <https://datatracker.ietf.org/doc/charter-ietf-v6ops/>

Meeting Presentations

- Pre-requirements
 - A new or updated in-charter draft
 - Some mailing list discussion
- Meeting time allocation rules
 - WG drafts first
 - Individual submissions next
- Chairs may deny a request for meeting agenda time
 - If pre-requirements have not been satisfied
 - If there is no time in the agenda
 - If the draft has previously failed a call for adoption
- Chairs must not deny a request for any other reason

Calls For Adoption

- Pre-requirements
 - A new or updated in-charter draft
 - Some mailing list discussion
- Chairs may deny a request
 - If pre-requirements have not been satisfied
 - If the draft has previously failed a call for adoption
- Chairs must not deny a request for any other reason
- When the chairs issue a call for adoption, they will also begin to track issues associated with the draft

Calls For Adoption: Judging Consensus

- Chairs must judge consensus to adopt
 - If the WG agrees that it wants to address the problem
 - If the WG agrees that the approach is reasonable
 - If all **blocking** issues have been addressed
- Good enough to provide a starting point; not good enough to publish
- Technical issues only
 - +1 support/opposition doesn't count
- Chairs must recuse themselves from consensus calls on drafts that they have co-authored

WG Last Call

- Pre-requirements
 - *All* issues have been addressed
- Chairs may deny a request
 - If pre-requirements have not been satisfied
- Chairs must not deny a request for any other reason
