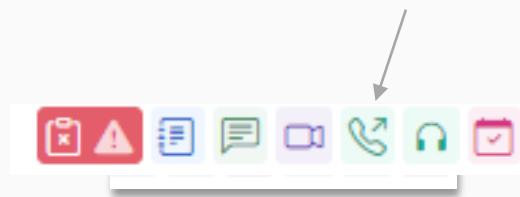
IETF 117 Meeting Tips
