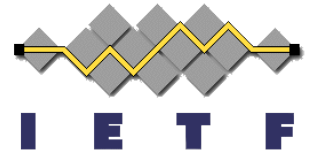

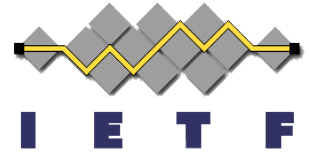

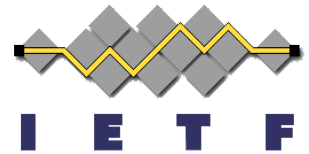

Intellectual Property



- When starting a presentation, you **MUST** say if:
 - There is IPR associated with your draft
 - The restrictions listed in section 5 of RFC 3978/4748 apply to your draft
- When asking questions or commenting on a draft:
 - You **MUST** disclose any IPR you know of relating to the technology under discussion

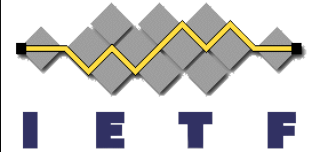
