RFC7154

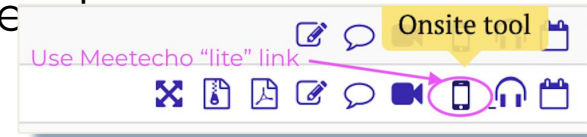
1. Treat colleagues with respect

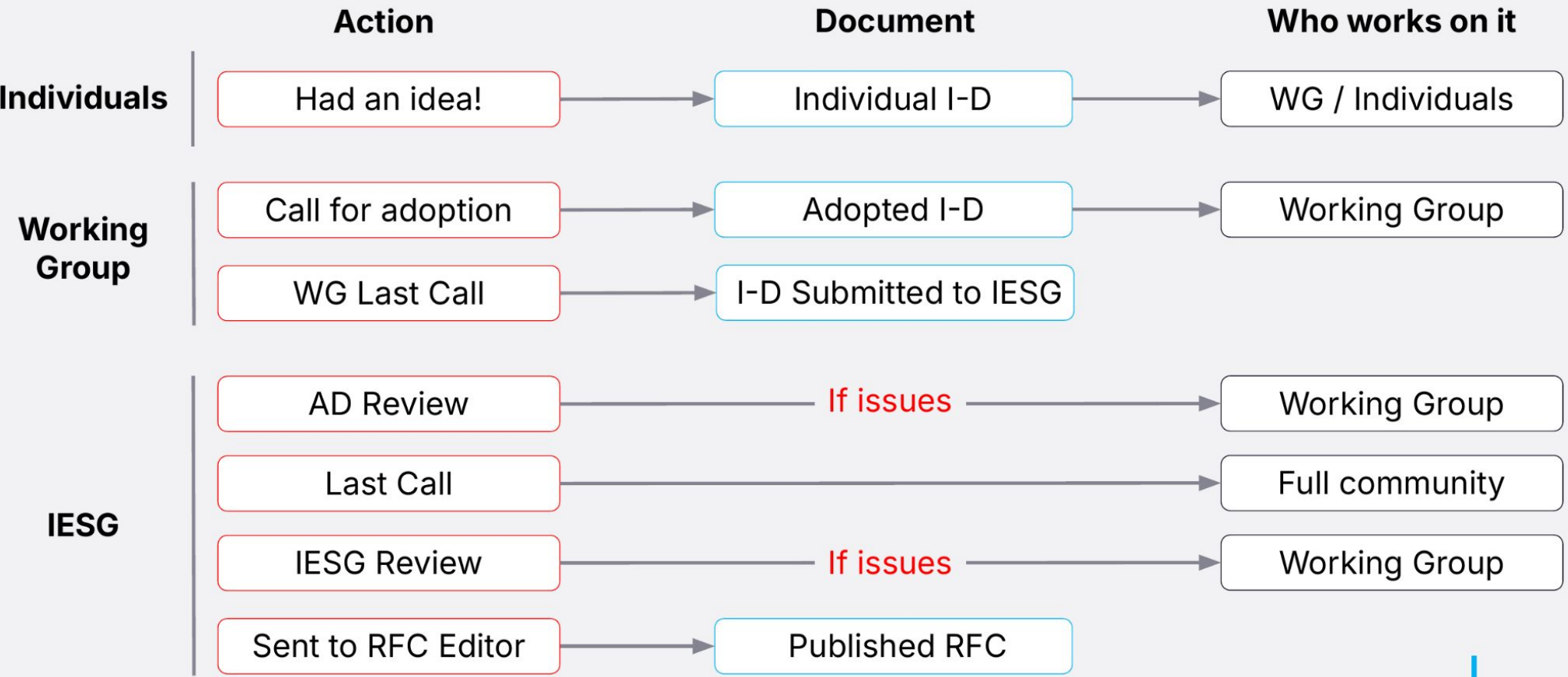

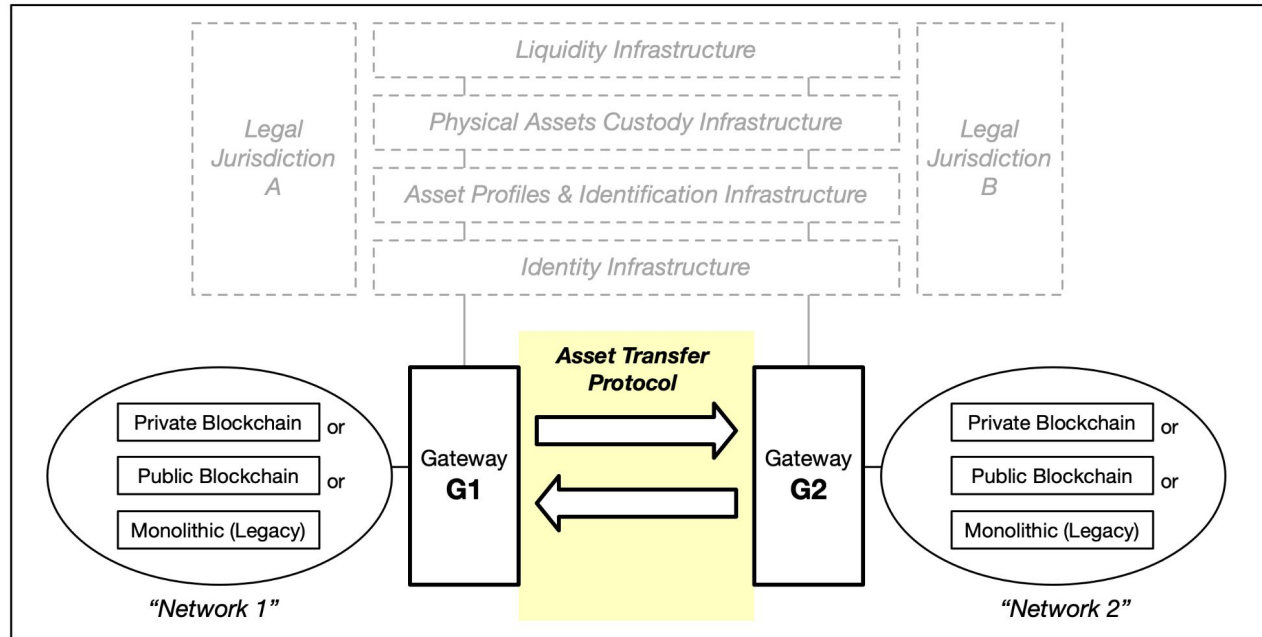
