Research Group

- The IRTF process document is RFC2014
- The requirements are different, mostly looser, than for an IETF wg
- Forming an RG requires approval of the IRTF chair
 - Formed in consultation with the IRSG and IAB

Research groups tend to be:

- Focused
- Long-term
- Small
- Open or closed
- May or may not meet at IETF
- May hold topical workshops
- Speak no louder than an other IETF member

How does the IETF benefit from RGs?

- Allows new proposals to mature before IETF adoption
- Focuses researchers on ideas important to the Internet
- Brings researchers into the IETF orbit

Why do research in the IRTF?

- Foster cross-organizational collaboration
- Obtain 'critical mass'
- Increase visibility and impact of research

Criteria for an RG

- Clarity of Scope
- Utility
- Energy & Expertise
- Leadership

- This proposal is about research
 - Proposing IETF work is out of scope
 - Research does not require consistency with other parts of the IETF technology suite
