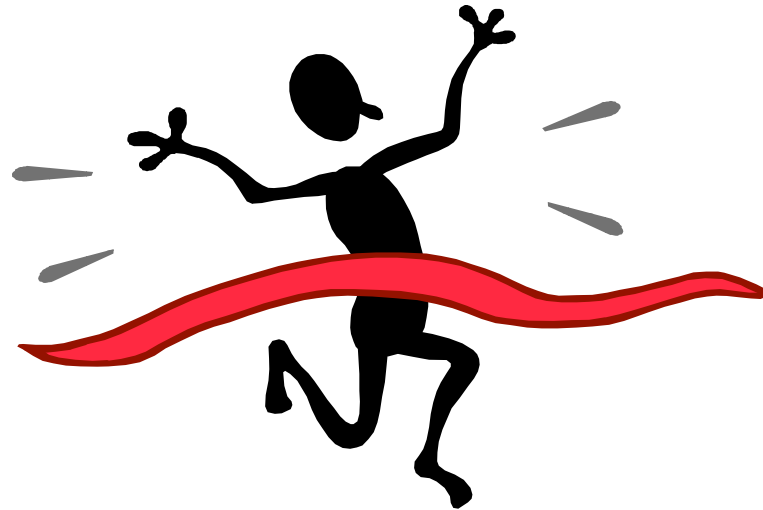
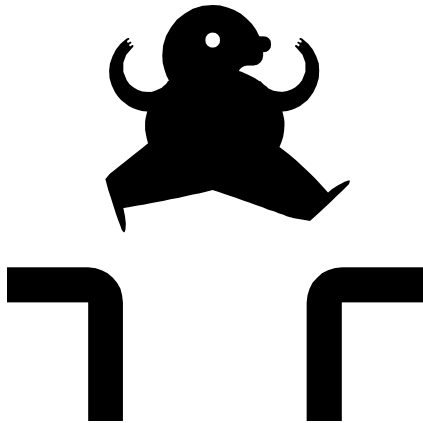

Interop and Interim

- Date constraints: Interop
 - 30 day notice
- Date constraints: Interim
 - 30 day notice
 - 30 day blackout after IETF: 1 September
 - 30 day blackout before IETF: 17 October
- Options
 - #1: Co-locate Interop and Interim (2 days + 2 days = 1 week)
 - #2: Interop first, followed by Interim ~3 weeks later
