



Working Group Milestones

- Dec 2011 Submit CDNI problem statement to IESG as Informational
- Mar 2012 Submit CDNI use cases to IESG as Informational
- Jun 2012 Submit CDNI framework to IESG as Informational
- Jun 2012 Submit CDNI requirements to IESG as Informational
- Dec 2012 Submit specification of the CDNI Request Routing interface to IESG as Proposed Standard
- Dec 2012 Submit specification of the CDNI Logging interface to IESG as Proposed Standard
- Dec 2012 Submit specification of the CDNI Control interface to IESG as proposed Standard
- Jun 2013 Submit specification of the CDNI Metadata Distribution interface to IESG as Proposed Standard

Open Item 1: Content Adaptation

- A number of requirements/use cases imply Content Adaptation (transcoding, transrating, ...) inside CDNs
 - Some aspects of Content Adaptation are irrelevant to CDNI (i.e. internal to a CDN)
 - How to perform/invoke actual Content Adaptation
 - Some aspects of Content Adaptation are potentially relevant to CDNI:
 - How dCDN is made aware of Content Adaptation policy (eg via CDNI Metadata interface)
 - How uCDN is made aware of dCDN Content Adaptation capabilities (eg via CDNI Control interface)
 - Should we include the relevant aspects of Content Adaptation in initial WG scope? No, May, Should, Must?

Open Item 2: Differentiated Delivery

- A number of requirements/use cases imply Differentiated Delivery of content inside CDNs (Regular vs Premium)
 - Some aspects of Differentiated Delivery do not belong to CDNI scope
 - SLAs for Differentiated Delivery
 - how to realize differentiation inside a CDN
 - Some aspects of Differentiated Delivery are potentially relevant to CDNI
 - How dCDN is made aware of Differentiated Delivery policy (e.g. what is the lowest acceptable downrating for this content) (eg via CDNI metadata)
 - Should we include the relevant aspects of Differentiated Delivery in initial WG scope? No, May, Should, Must?

Open Item 3: DECE/Ultra-Violet

- Charter says:
 - “*The CDNI WG will also coordinate with relevant groups outside the IETF such as UltraViolet.*”
- First step is to assess the relevance of Ultra-Violet to CDNI
