



A few additional words after previous sessions:


- We should not react to specific incidents but rather overall state of security in the Internet





- IESG statement issued just before this meeting
Specifies a policy “IETF participants should not engage in harassment” and a contact point for concerns (ombudsperson)
- Linda Klieforth (ISOC HR) is acting as a temporary ombudsperson here in Vancouver
- Next: select and train ombudsperson(s)
- Next: consider a BCP-level policy on this issue

- Draft-kolkman-proposed-standard-clarified to be approved – important for recognition of IETF standards elsewhere
- Draft-moonesamy-ietf-conduct-3184bis being reviewed – guidance on the conduct for IETF participants (role of newcomers etc)
- Draft-resnick-on-consensus also being discussed – but just information, not a change
