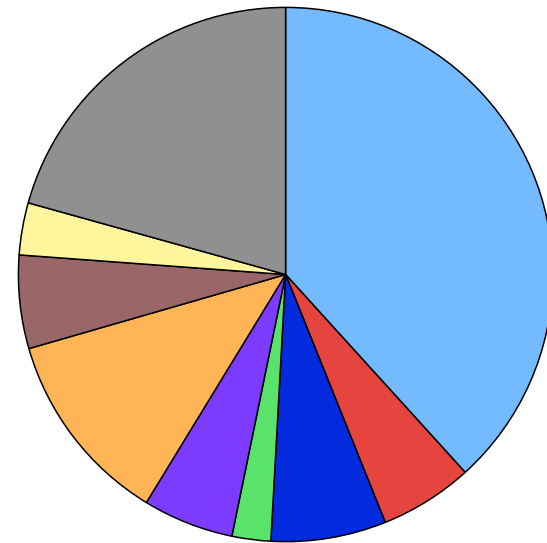

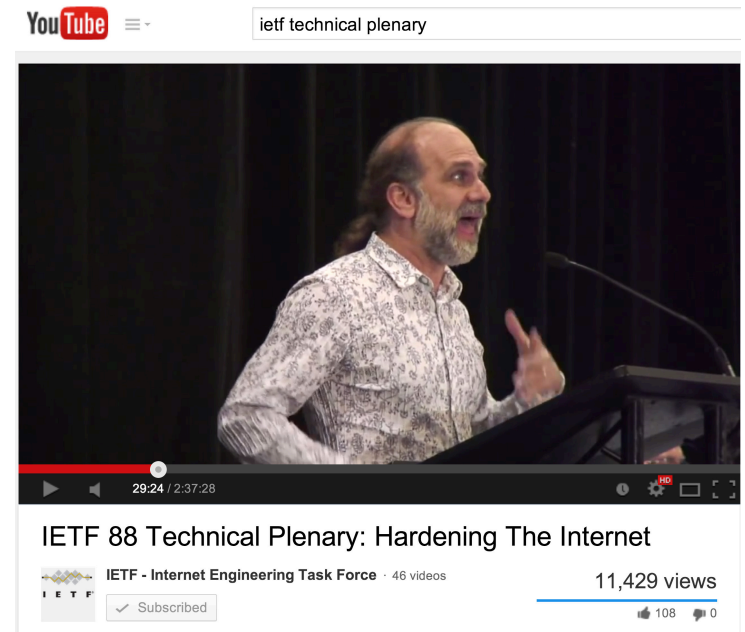

# Pervasive Monitoring

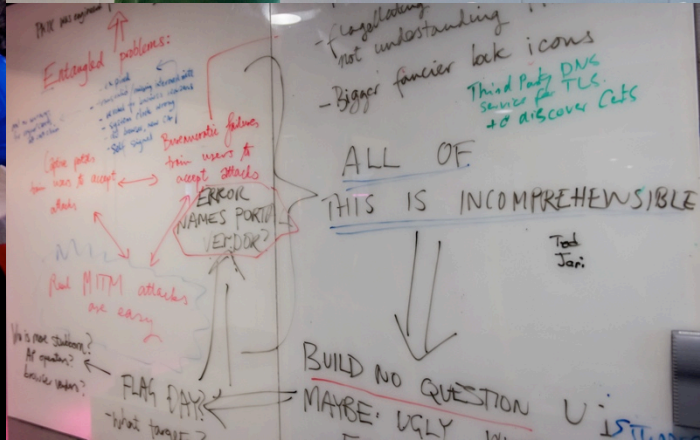
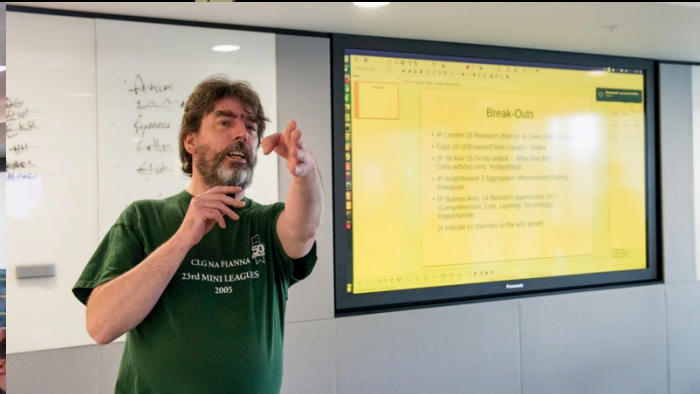
Initial excitement followed by the hard work

- IESG statement issued in 2013  
Specifies a policy “IETF participants should not engage in harassment” and a contact point for concerns (ombudsperson)
- Linda Klieforth (ISOC HR) is still acting as a temporary ombudsperson here in London
- Pete Resnick and Adrian Farrell have begun work on a more detailed procedures document

- Need to be engaged in discussions: operator forums, your local ISOC chapter meeting, industry meeting, IGF, other I\* organisation meeting, etc

  - Often in our own words
- We occasionally speak in “our own opinion only” mode – but needs care to avoid misinterpretation
