- High-volume list with some problems
- Considering adding facilitators

# IESG Telechat Participation Experiment

- Already open for document shepherds
- Potential further interest (e.g., authors, transparency)
- An experiment; to end at IETF 91
- Determine if there's interest and/or if it works in practice

# Role of Standards and Open Source



- Some discussion of this in the IETF and IESG
- Running code is obviously a key ingredient in the IETF, but not only code
- IETF and other standards organisations are needed when there is a need for agreement across different implementations
- Complementary with open source efforts
- Use the right tool for the right task

# Role of Standards and Open Source, Continued



- World moves faster, and SDOs need to be able to accommodate for that pace
- IESG would like to underline that
  - WGs can be created when there is agreement to do so, physical BOF meetings not always required
  - WGs should have solution work from day 1
  - IETF work should respect rough consensus
  - Good experiences from efforts with weekly schedules
- OPS area leading some trials (on data models)
