




IETF 97 Participants



IANA Stewardship Transition



- Agreements became in effect on October 1, 2016, as planned
 - Updated ICANN-IETF SLA
 - IETF Trust has taken ownership of trademarks
 - IETF Trust is working with ICANN and a 3rd party vendor to implement the domain name transfers
- IETF IANAPLAN WG has been closed

IASA 2.0

- IETF's administrative arrangements were created in 2005
- They have and are serving us well, but the world and tasks have changed... new challenges
 - Starting to look at the needs going forward: draft-daigleiasa-retrospective
 - Setting up a project where we (IETF community) can perform a comprehensive review
 - Good time for that review now
- This is a chance for us to have an effect on the arrangements



IETF Mailing Lists and Networks

Mailing Lists and DMARC

- DMARC, SPF and DKIM techniques are used to fight, among other things, email spoofing
- DMARC makes it possible for email providers to have a policy where spoofed emails should be rejected by their receivers
- Unfortunately, common mailing list practices fall under the category of "spoofing"
- This has caused and will cause pain for IETF mailing list users

Mailing Lists and DMARC

- Any action (including inaction) will have some consequences
- The IESG understands that a decision is needed, and is preparing for this
- We are working closely with the tools team and e-mail experts on what our options are
- Will post plans to mailing list, and make a decision within three weeks
- Implementation soon after; will need to re-assess and possibly decide new actions in six months

- Please note that we have a number test networks, e.g., ietf-nat64 — using those and reporting bugs would be useful
- Would it be useful to further develop & expand these networks and their usage? How?
