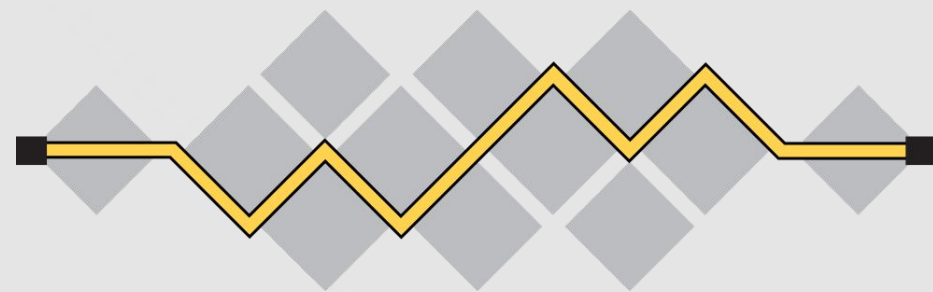



# Background

- Initially set up as a convenient way to house chair-focused content:
  - chairs training artifacts,
  - updated information about “how to schedule an interim meeting”
- Currently organized around common chair tasks
- Integrates content (mostly links) from: [www.ietf.org/chairs](http://www.ietf.org/chairs)
- Does not (yet) integrate (all) content from current IETF WG Chairs wiki: <https://trac.ietf.org/trac/wgchairs/>
