#### Scheduling:

- IETF, Montreal – put in for a session, but do not have a date yet. Submit for waivers if needed. Remote fee waivers will not be rejected.
  - o October 20<sup>th</sup> is the submission deadline.
- Will have another interim in November and then we'll decide about how to move forward. Plan will be to move docs forward soon.

#### 1. Threat Model

- It will be helpful to get this piece finalized, and then move on to the rest.
- This piece is quite lengthy, and we may need to consider whether we need all the citations. We need folks to read this through and let us know if there are comments or thoughts or even if people are okay with it. Silence makes it hard to determine consensus, which we need to get at.
  - o Maggie is trying to get this to a better place to get it out for review.
- Remote disablement –
  - o We need criteria for remotely disabling tags. There are disagreements about the costs. If the timeframe in which you have to be in proximity of the tag is long enough, it should reduce the likelihood of a list of possible attacks.
  - o The duration that the tag is away is not something that the tag knows, so it's not enforceable.
  - o This could be a good discussion for IETF Montreal to get more ideas. It would be great to have this as a formal presentation topic.
- Repo – down to 6 issues.
  - o “Lost mode” – what is meant by that? Is this in scope?
  - o Terminology across documents. There was one set of terminology in the protocol doc, and it would be useful to make sure we're all using the same terms. We had talked previously about the terms living with the accessory protocol, though we haven't had time to review it.
  - o “Attacker” and “Victim” – can provide context or possibly edit to “target”

#### Process –

- Working Group Last Call – goes out to anyone on the working group list
- Deb does her review
- Then goes out to IETF Last Call - cross-area review, lots of people submitting comments.

Not sure if we will go past step 1 until we have all documents ready. We can ask for targeted reviews if we're happy with the document. Generally, the third step will get new eyes into the process.
